- What kinds of specialists should I consult with?
- Are there hospitals or health centers that specialize in desmoid tumor treatment?

If you want to know more about **desmoid tumor management**, consider asking:

- How will I know if my tumor is progressing?*
- What symptoms should I be aware of and how can I track them?
- What potential treatment options are available to me? What are the risks and benefits associated with each of these options?
- What are the risks and benefits of surgery? Can my desmoid tumor come back after it's been removed?
- What treatments do desmoid tumor experts recommend?
- If I experience potential side effects during treatment, are there ways to help manage them?
